### ABOUT THIS QUALIFICATION

The Certificate III in Carpentry provides individuals with a broad range of skills and knowledge required to work in the residential and commercial construction sectors. The course focuses on developing capabilities in structural carpentry, including the construction of wall frames, roof trusses, ceilings, flooring systems, and external cladding.

This Certificate covers areas such as interpreting construction drawings, selecting and cutting materials, using hand and power tools, assembling building components, erecting scaffolding, and working safely at heights. Students also learn to follow industry safety procedures and building codes while working on real and simulated job sites.

Through this course, students gain hands-on experience and practical skills in teamwork, workplace communication, and problem-solving – all essential to working effectively in the carpentry trade.

### PATHWAYS

This qualification provides a pathway to employment as a trade-qualified carpenter within the residential and commercial construction sectors. Occupational outcomes may include:

- **Carpenter – Commercial and Residential**
- **Formwork Carpenter**
- **Framing Carpenter**
- **Joiner (Site Work)**

Upon completion, students may choose to pursue further training such as the Certificate IV in Building and Construction, which can lead to roles in site supervision or small business ownership. Graduates may also progress to the Diploma of Building and Construction (Building), providing a pathway toward builder registration or licensure, subject to local regulatory requirements.

Graduates will be equipped with the practical and theoretical skills necessary for further education or employment within the broader construction industry.

2. Evidence that they have studied in English for at least five years in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Republic of Ireland, South Africa, United Kingdom or United States

3. Evidence that, within two years of their application date, they have successfully completed in Australia a foundation course or a senior secondary certificate of education or a Certificate III or higher level qualification, from the Australian Qualifications Framework.

4. Applicants originating from students visa assessment levels 1 and 2 countries without the required IELTS or equivalent score must undertake the Language, Literacy, Numeracy & Digital (LLND) test.
